



International Diploma in Deity Worship at Mayapur Academy is a four-month on-site intensive educational program that trains students in various aspects of Pujari.

Developed on the instruction and teachings of His Divine Grace A.C Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada (ISKCON's Founder-Acharya), the entire program focuses on the appropriate mood, values, skills, and knowledge required to be a pujari in any of the ISKCON temples.

This unique educational program has produced hundreds of the finest pujaris within ISKCON Communities over the last 18 years, contributing to the increase in standards of Brahminical culture worldwide. All our courses and faculties emphasize the essential values of the right mood that is built on the foundation of knowledge along with the expert skills

The full 16-week program comprises of following units:

Admission Criterion

The course is open to all initiated devotees in good standing. While preference will be given to those with Brahminical initiation, devotees with first initiation and Gurukul devotees may also apply.

IMPORTANT: Applying to attend the course does not automatically guarantee acceptance. We consider all applications individually before notifying prospective students of acceptance. For the duration of the course, devotees are required to attend the full morning program, follow the 4 regulative principles, and chant at least 16 rounds of Japa every day. This is a mandatory prerequisite.

Frequently Asked Quesions (FAQs)

What is Mayapur Academy?

Mayapur Academy is a joint educational initiative of the ISKCON Mayapur Deity Department and ISKCON Deity Worship Ministry that offers several courses throughout the year to train students in different aspects of deity worship. All the courses are designed based on instructions and teachings of His Divine Grace A.C Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada, ISKCON's Founder Acharya to fulfill his desire for the development of deity worship and Brahminical culture within ISKCON.

Its campus is located at ISKCON Mayapur in Chaitanya Bhavan

The Academy has classrooms with separate rooms for deity dressing with sets of deities to train in different aspects of deity dressing, a deity kitchen classroom with eight six-gas-burner stoves, a lecture room, and a library with an expanding collection of devotional literature. The facilities at Mayapur Academy ensure that each student has a clean and structured learning environment to maximize the benefits of learning the brahminical arts.

Do you accept non initiated or first initiated devotees for this course?

While the preference is given to devotees with Brahminical initiation, several of our courses are opened for first initiated and non initiated devotees as well. Some courses like Samskaras for men are not open to non initiated devotees. However, being initiated or even second initiated does not guarantee admission into our programs. Each application is screened individually, specifically for our 4 month diploma programs.

How to enroll for the admission in the course?

All application forms are available at https://mayapuracademy.org/ Each applicant is required to fill a detailed form that also requires a letter of recommendation from the Temple President or recognised leader of the community. Each application is screened individually. Since there are limited seats for the course and preference is given to those with Brahminical initiation, each applicant is notified about the status of their application. There may be individual calls with the applicant or with the leader recommending them for the course, in case we need more clarity about certain aspects. All the approved applicants are then required to deposit the fee before the deadline for the admission into the program.

I don't wish to do the entire course, can I enroll for only some specific unit?

We give first preference to students who have enrolled for the full diploma program that is of 4 month duration. If the capacity of the individual course that you are intending to do is remaining (there is a maximum limit to each of our individual courses), seats are then filled on a first come first serve basis. We recommend all the students to apply timely and not wait for the last moment.

What is the difference between Diploma and Certificate courses?

The full 4 month program is called Diploma Whereas, if someone is attending only some specific unit and not the full program, they are given certificates. For both diploma or certificate, devotees are required to attend the full morning program, follow the 4 regulative principles, and chant at least 16 rounds of Japa every day. This is a mandatory prerequisite.

Do you provide accommodation, Prasada for the duration of the course?

No, we don't provide that. These arrangements are to be made by students themselves.


Can a non English speaker enroll for these courses?

Temple Worship Unit-Syllabus

Facilitators Nrsimha Kavaca das Murli Manohara das Krishnakanta das Ananda Lila devi dasi

10 credit points

Course Description & Aims

This course offers a comprehensive introduction to the principles, practices, and values of deity worship, an essential aspect of the Gaudiya Vaishnava tradition and devotional service. Students will gain a deep understanding of the significance of purity in Kṛṣṇa consciousness, exploring how a lifestyle of purity supports spiritual growth and effective deity worship. The course covers practical aspects such as personal cleanliness, paraphernalia cleaning, and the proper execution of rituals like ācamana and samanya arghya.

Students will also delve into the philosophical and scriptural foundations of deity worship, learning about the role and importance of deities, the authenticity of the practice, and the relationship between devotees and the Supreme Lord. Key rituals, including ārati and Ṣoḍaśopacāra Pūjā, will be thoroughly explored, providing students with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform these ceremonies with devotion and precision. Additionally, the course emphasizes the power of mantras and meditation as tools for deepening one's connection to the spiritual reality. Through a combination of theoretical learning and practical training, participants will be equipped to carry out the basic items of daily temple worship and appreciate its integral role in devotional life.





Brahminical Culture and ethics

FACILITATOR: Bimla Prasad Das Premanjana Das

Course Description: Core Unit

Credit points: 10

This course, offered by Mayapur Academy within the ISKCON framework, provides an in-depth exploration of Brahminical culture and ethics, focusing on cultivating the values, practices, and knowledge essential for leading and guiding a spiritual society. Emphasizing purity, humility, and ethical principles, the course aims to prepare devotees to embody and promote Brahminical living in their personal and community lives.

Participants will study foundational texts and teachings, learning how to apply Brahminical principles in both personal conduct and temple service. The course also highlights the role of a brāhmaṇa in offering guidance and direction to social and managerial structures according to guru, sādhu, and Śāstra. Devotees will engage in elementary teacher training and learn how to give Śāstra classes, equipping them with the skills needed to lead and educate others in the spiritual community.

Through interactive discussions, scriptural study, and practical exercises, students will gain a comprehensive understanding of how to live and teach the ideals of Brahminical culture, ensuring they are well-prepared to guide and inspire others within ISKCON and beyond.






Cooking Unit

Course Description: Core Unit

Credit Points: 4

The Cooking unit introduces the basic principles of cooking, where students will gain a wealth of culinary traditions, including cooking theory, kitchen technique, ingredient handling and entail the necessary values when cooking for Krishna. The course offers the students to acquire skills required to; prepare spices, use fresh herbs, grind spices, cut vegetables, cook various rice, dals, subjis, savories, chutneys, sweets and drink preparations as used in Vedic and other culinary styles. As an added feature to the course, students are given opportunities to learn from some of the prominent cooks in Mayapur with relevance to cooking artistry, expertise cuisines and practical skills to apply in the kitchen. The assorted cooking principles taught, would enable the students to plan a balanced menu in accordance with traditional Vaisnava practices and cook Raja Bhoga.





Deity Dressing

Facilitators

Kurma Chaitanya Das Krishna Kanta Das

Course Description

This course is designed to teach the art of creating structured turbans and dressing 3-4 feet Radha Krishna deities for day darshan. Expert instructors will guide the students through principles of art theory and practice suitable even for those who come from non-artistic background

10 credit points

Introduction to Art Theory and Turban Making

- Overview of art theory principles (balance, proportion, unity, harmony, emphasis, movement, rhythm, and variety)
- Application of art theory to turban making
- Introduction to four different turban structures
- Practical demonstration of turban making and deity dressing

Practice Turban Making and Deity Dressing

- Hands-on training in each of the four turban structures
- Practical guidance on pinning turban pieces, jewelry, and flowers
- Daily practice dressing 4-foot Radha Krishna Deities under instructor guidance
- Focus on technical aspects of deity dressing, including pinning cloth an garlands

Intensive Practice

- Focus on speed and precision in turban making and deity dressing
- Timed practice sessions to build efficiency and accuracy

Assessment

- Practical assessment: fully dress Radha Krishna in 90 minutes
- Theory assessment: written test on art theory and turban making principles

Bonus Decorative Eye Painting Class

- Learn the art of decorative eye painting
- Practical guidance and hands-on experience





Dress Designing Syllabus

FACILITATOR: Ananda Lila Devi Dasi

Course Description: Elective Unit

Credit points: 2

Many temples have difficulty finding suitable dresses for their Deities. In this unit, the students will learn about the variations in design, colours, materials, and the embroidery technique with pearls, silk thread, beads, etc.

The Dress Design unit will introduce the elements and principles of art, illustrations, and their usage in deity outfit designing. The course offers to aid students' familiarity with colour theory and different fabric qualities and their consequent preferred characteristics in accordance with the outfit design. As an added feature to the course, students are given the opportunity to go on a guided tour of Radha Madhava's sewing room, providing them with an experience of real workshop exposure. The principles and techniques thus taught would enable them to represent an illustration of Radha Krishna deity outfit design.



Festivals Unit





Course Description

4 credit points

This comprehensive course delves into the role and significance of Gauḍīya Vaiṣṇava festivals, guiding students through the intricacies of planning, arranging, and observing these important events. Students will explore the needs and benefits of festival observance, focusing on both major and minor celebrations within the tradition. The course will cover the key elements that contribute to a successful festival, including a detailed look at activities that can enhance the experience for both devotees and the public.

Participants will learn to determine festival dates using the Gaurābda Calendar and gain practical skills in organizing and observing festivals at their temples. Special focus will be given to the observance of Āvirbhāva-Tirobhāva (appearance and disappearance days of prominent Vaiṣṇavas) and Chandan Yatra, including practical training in deity care and applying chandan. The course also offers an overview of abhiṣeka (deity bathing ceremonies), ensuring students are well-equipped to lead and inspire through festival observances. Practical assignments and discussions will deepen their understanding and ability to execute these cultural and spiritual celebrations.



Jewellery Making Unit

FACILITATORS Hariballabhi Devi Dasi



Course Description

2 credit points

This hands-on course introduces students to the art of beadwork, focusing on creating a variety of jewelry pieces. Starting with an introduction to different beads, materials, and techniques, students will learn to select appropriate colors and shapes to craft stringed necklaces and their variations. The course progresses to more complex structures, including 4-bead and 6-bead designs, which are used to create intricate bracelets and necklaces.

Advanced sessions will cover 8-bead structures for crafting earrings and circular designs for waistbelts, incorporating various techniques. Additionally, students will explore the creation of specialized items like anklets, damini (forehead ornaments), turban hangings, and ties for jewelry. Practical assignments will allow students to apply their skills and submit their completed projects for evaluation. This course offers a comprehensive journey into the world of beadwork, suitable for both beginners and those looking to refine their craft.



Ladies Samskaras Unit-SYLLABUS

2 credit points

Course Description

The Ladies Samskaras Class will provide an introduction to and appreciation of the exalted position of Vedic Samskaras in Gaudiya Vaisnava society, as delineated by Gopal Bhatta Goswami, Srila Bhaktisiddhanta Sarasvati Thakura, and Srila Prabhupada. Students will also learn to plan and execute the dasavidha-samskaras in accordance with traditional Vaisnava practices.

Beginning with an introduction to the concept of samskaras, students will learn to distinguish between mundane rites of passage and their Vedic counterparts, establishing a strong foundation in their spiritual and cultural significance. The course covers key samskaras in detail, including the Vivaha-samskara (marriage ceremony) and Garbhadhana-samskara (conception ceremony), with a focus on the teachings of Srila Prabhupada and practical guidance for execution.

Students will also study the samskaras associated with pregnancy and childhood, gaining insight into their importance and procedures as outlined in the scriptures. Practical aspects of coordinating and performing samskaras are unraveled, equipping students with the skills to carry out these ceremonies. Additional sessions include the art of rangoli, a final exam, and a Suci/Muci class with practicum, ensuring a well-rounded understanding of Vedic samskaras and their application in everyday life.



Men Samskaras Unit – SYLLABUS





Course Description

2 credit points

This course provides an in-depth study of the major samskāras (sacred rites of passage) within the Gaudiya Vaishnava tradition, with a focus on both theoretical understanding and practical application. Students will explore the history and significance of these rites, starting with an introduction to samskāras and the basics of mantra recitation. The course covers key samskāras, including Garbhadhana (conception) and Vivaha (marriage), guided by the teachings of Srila Prabhupada.

Practical sessions include building yajna kundas (sacrificial fire pits) and performing initiation yajnas, with students engaging in hands-on learning through multiple yajna performances. The course emphasizes mastering the art of mantra recitation and the practical execution of these ceremonies. Discussions, debates, and a comprehensive overview of saṁskāras enrich the learning experience. Assessments include a written exam and a practical yajna performance in pairs, ensuring students are fully equipped to perform these sacred rites.



Tulasi Care and Worship



Course Description

2 credit points

The "Tulasi Devi Care and Worship" course provides an in-depth exploration of Tulasi Devi's significance and the essential practices for her care and worship. Over the span of the entire diploma program, students will engage in a fourmonth period dedicated to growing and caring for their personalized Tulasi plant. The course covers the scriptural basis and devotional importance of Tulasi Devi, emphasizing both theoretical knowledge and practical skills. Students will learn about the appropriate methods for cultivating Tulasi, including soil preparation, watering, light requirements, and pest management. Additionally, the course addresses the correct uses of Tulasi leaves, manjaris, wood, and branches in devotional service, including making Tulasi garlands. Throughout this period, students will apply their knowledge to the ongoing care of their Tulasi plants, gaining firsthand experience in maintaining and honoring this sacred deity. By the end of the course, students will be equipped with a deep understanding of Tulasi Devi's worship and practical skills for her care.



Astrology



FACILITATOR: His Holiness Bhanu Swami Maharaja

Course Description

The "Astrology" unit at Mayapur Academy offers a concise yet comprehensive introduction to the fundamentals of astrology within the context of Vaisnava practices. This short course provides students with essential knowledge on selecting auspicious times for various samskāras (sacred rites) and other Vaisnava activities. The curriculum covers the principles of determining favourable timings for significant events, including the naming of children and understanding the Vaiṣṇava calendar. Students will explore the zodiac and its relevance to spiritual practices, gaining insights into how astrological considerations can enhance devotional life.



Gayatri



Course Description

2 credit points

The "Gayatri Initiation Training" course at Mayapur Academy is a comprehensive twelve-lesson program designed for second initiates or those awaiting their second initiation in ISKCON. Spanning five sessions, this course provides an in-depth exploration of Gayatri mantras within the Gaudiya Vaishnavism tradition. The initial sessions establish a foundation by introducing the significance of Gayatri and its relevance in ISKCON, including Srila Prabhupada's vision for Gayatri initiations. Students will learn about the role of Gayatri in relation to the Hare Krsna maha-mantra, the distinctions between Krsna mantra and Krsna nama, and the various mantras within the Gaudiya tradition. The course also covers the sacred thread, techniques to improve Gayatri japa chanting, and current procedures for Gayatri initiation. Emphasis is placed on cultivating brahminical qualities and attitudes, aiming to create learned brahmana-vaishnavas who contribute effectively to society. The final lessons foster a deep appreciation for Gayatri mantras, encouraging further study and research in line with Srila Prabhupada's teachings and the broader Gaudiya Vaishnava tradition.

The practicum involves the hands-on application of course learnings through practical services in the temple. A few days are set aside specifically for these dedicated services, both after the final course unit and during special festivals.



This segment helps students internalize what they've learned by serving the deities directly under guidance. It nurtures a spirit of humility, reinforces temple standards, and prepares students to serve confidently and competently in real-world temple environments.

Flexible Study Options for Earning Your Diploma

The Diploma in Deity Worship can be completed in an intensive 16-week residential format within a single year, or pursued flexibly over a period of up to 3 years, based on the student's pace and availability.

To qualify for the diploma, students must earn a total of 52 credits, which include:

- 32 credits from core units
- 10 credits from elective units
- 10 credits from practicum (temple service)

This structure allows both full-time and part-time students to progress according to their capacity while maintaining the integrity of training.





